What is printing?	Making a print involves transferring an image from one surface to another.
What is a repeating print?	This printing process can result in repeated identical images over and over again
What are the different types of printing?	There are four main types of printmaking: relief, intaglio, lithography, and screen printing. Each colour in a print usually requires a separate stone, plate, block, or stencil, and any of these basic processes might be combined in the creation of a finished work.

Key Vocabulary

Spelling	Definition/Sentence
Printing	the art of producing an image by pressing with an incised (cut) or raised surface.
Stencil	a template made by cutting away details to create a physical negative for spreading ink through to create a positive image
Texture	the appearance and feel of a surface
Stylisation	the simplifying of detail within an image or design.
Motif	a form or shape in a design or pattern.
Intaglio print	a print from a design that has been cut or etched so that the printing ink stays in the gouges.
A repeat pattern	a motif that is repeated.
A rubbing	an image that is created by laying paper over an incised (cut) or raised surface and rubbing with a crayon or pencil.
